CROSSING THE ROAD

To Love Our Neighbor

Dear Friends,

hat do hurricanes, heroes and Hail
Marys have in common? More than
one might think. Hurricane Helene
wrought "biblical" destruction upon Western
North Carolina in the southern Appalachians.
The increasing amounts of energy in the
atmosphere from global warming have unleashed
storms that in turn are increasingly described as a
"Once in a 100/1000-year event." But Hurricane
Helene also brought out the best in the people
who live in those mountainous, forested valleys,
supposedly safely removed from such things.

The stories of neighbors helping, even saving, one another remind us powerfully that everyone is in fact our neighbor when "all hell breaks loose."



The parable of the Good Samaritan resonates with persons of faith and persons of no faith. We all can immediately identify with the robbed and beaten man lying by the side of the road, including the enormity of his gratitude for his savior. If we are honest with ourselves, we also can identify with those who choose not to see, to cross the road to avoid that recent unpleasantness. How sad then that so much of the time we have trouble identifying with the Good Samaritan at the center of the story. Does it really take a natural disaster to reveal that we are neighbors in the real sense of that word? Why is it so hard for us to take Jesus at his word? The worldview in

which Jesus lived sees the Good Samaritan as the other, the outcast, the least likely to do the right thing, and yet Jesus uses him to drive home his message.

Can only impending death and destruction cause the scales to fall from our eyes to see with depth and clarity that all human beings are neighbors, are family? Are heroes born of necessity or just a few naturally born that way, the right mix of genes and experience? The parable of the Good Samaritan suggests that being a "daily" hero is not the purview of only the few.

The Priest and the Levite who choose not to intervene are educated people but apparently not trained in the way of the heart. To be a disciple of Jesus requires us to commit to being trained in the ways of the heart. It is not easy, and it takes time. It is a primary reason that we do the same thing every Sunday, Eucharist after Eucharist.

This is where the Hail Mary comes in. Some of us have lived in exile for the last 20 years, a generation, having no football team in Washington to root for. One iconic play last Sunday against the Bears transformed strangers into neighbors, cynics into fans, robbing the toxic atmosphere of the nation's capital of its divisive energy. In the good



old days, the crime rate really did drop during football games and Washington really did function better when Washington was winning. Life is strange. That Hail Mary didn't drop out of heaven, although Jayden Daniel's pass looked like it did. Rather the team had trained over time in case disaster struck and only 2 seconds are left on the clock. This is why sports can draw people together in spasms of joy.

God wants joy to be more than a Hail Mary in our life. The kind of JOY that God wants for us is to have been formed into instruments of love ready to act at a moment's notice. I could be wrong, but I suspect that none of those ordinary folk in North

Carolina acting like real neighbors battling the hurricane gave much thought about who their neighbor was going to vote for on November 5th.





May the peace of the Lord always be with you.

Amen (BCP, 216).

NOV 3 Pray for quiet confidence

O God of peace, who hast taught us that in returning and rest we shall be saved, in quietness and in confidence shall be our strength: By the might of thy Spirit lift us, we pray thee, to thy presence, where we may be still and know that thou art God; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen (BCP, 832).

NOV 4 Pray for the nation

Lord God Almighty, you have made all the peoples of the earth for your glory, to serve you in freedom and in peace: Give to the people of our country a zeal for justice and the strength of forbearance, that we may use our liberty in accordance with your gracious will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen (BCP, 258).

NOV 5 Election Day Pray for the election

Almighty God, to whom we must account for all our powers and privileges: Guide the people of the United States in the election of officials and representatives; that, by faithful administration and wise laws, the rights of all may be protected and our nation be enabled to fulfill your purposes; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen (BCP, 822).

NOV 6 Day After Election

Pray to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ today, no matter the election results

O God: Give me strength to live another day; Let me not turn coward before its difficulties or prove recreant to its duties; Let me not lose faith in other people; Keep me sweet and sound of heart, despite ingratitude, treachery, or meanness; Preserve me from minding little stings or giving them; Help me to keep my heart clean, and to live so honestly and fearlessly that no outward failure can dishearten me or take away the joy of conscious integrity; Open wide the eyes of my soul that I may see good in all things; Grant me this day some new vision of thy truth; Inspire me with the spirit of joy and gladness; and make me the cup of salvation to suffering souls; in the name of the strong Deliverer, our only Lord, and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.



The music for the service is the *Requiem* by Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924), sung by St. Mary's Choir with soloists and orchestra. The service will be followed by a festive reception in Paca Hall. November Hymn of the Month Now thank we all our God, Hymn No. 397

Martin Rinckart, Archdeacon in Eilenburg, Saxony wrote this hymn as a table grace for his children to sing and is dated June 24, 1630. The English translation by Catherine Winkworth was first published in London in 1858, and the hymn has appeared in Episcopal hymnals since 1871. This German "Te Deum" has transcended its German roots to become a familiar hymn in many parts of the world. Paradoxically it was so familiar to the English speaking world that it was used to celebrate the defeat of Nazi Germany.

ovember tends to be a month when we are surrounded with imagery encouraging thankfulness, generosity and appreciation for our many gifts. Ambassador Lagon has worked on human trafficking over the last quarter century as a U.S. Senate staffer on the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000; as U.S. Ambassador-At-Large and Director for the Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking; as CEO of Polaris, the leading U.S. non-profit combating trafficking which leads the primary hotline for the U.S. government; and, co-founded and advises the Global Business Coalition Against Trafficking.

Mark P. Lagon has been worshipping at St. Mary's since 2005 with his wife Susan, daughter Elena, and mother Sonja.

He's worked on human trafficking over the last quarter century:

1999-2000: As Senate Foreign Relations Committee staffer helping finalize the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 creating the U.S. government's domestic and international apparatus to combat trafficking

2007-2009: He served as U.S. Ambassador-At-Large and Director for the Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking

2009-2010: He was CEO of the leading U.S. non-profit combatting trafficking, Polaris, which operates the primary hotline for the U.S. government. Co-founded the Global Business Coalition Against Trafficking in 2012, which includes Coca-Cola, Google and Marriott – and is its senior advisor still.

Currently, he is:

Chief Policy Officer at Friends of the Global Fight Against AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria.

Senior Fellow at the faith-based Trinity Forum.

Adjunct Professor in the Masters in Foreign Service program at Georgetown University.

He used to be full-time curricular chair at that Georgetown Program before becoming President of Freedom House in 2015.

A PhD in political science, his 2nd book was <u>Human</u> <u>Dignity and the Future of Global Institutions</u> inspired by human trafficking and HIV/AIDS.
